CommunityAcquired Pneumonia

Diagnosis

Symptoms: C ough (generally with increased sputum), fevers, shortness of breath, or chest pain Exam: Tachycardia, tachypnea, or decreased oxygen saturation with rhonchi or crackles

x In patients with obvious signs and symptoms of community-acquired pneumonia (CAP), it is reasonable to initiate antibiotics
